Both of them gently left the grasshopper on a big tree in the garden and went home happily and confidently as they have achieved something.



Dhanu said, "Is it so? Though the sun is very far from us, we feel very hot in summer."




Mr. Astro can you please tell me, "What about the nearest planet?"
